For thousands of area residents, the joy of the promise of spring has centered on the Capital District Garden & Flower Show that commences from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday at the new Valley Community College.

Highlights include beautiful floral and landscape exhibits, more than 100 commercial vendors, and numerous educational displays, expert advice ranging from proper pruning techniques to avoiding ticks and pesticides.

"We have long said 'show every year,'" said the show's owner, William DeLorenzo, the show's designer, about operations in apartments, ponds, and water features. "We can't wait of better times and meet a lot of new people as well. It's just a pleasure to spring."

The display has a full-time staff and will be held at the site's new location of operation.

"We're expanding our operations further to allow for greater propagation of the need to make it available to the public and hobbyists in a way that's not seen from the show," DeLorenzo said. "This is all very easy stuff that is used in apartment complexes, schools, on the grounds of it, many well-maintained and driving into the region's reputation to stay great."
